Series Points

- Athletes start a minimum of two races to qualify for overall series awards. One of those events must be Nationals.
- Only the best two results will be used to determine overall series points for that athlete.
- Points will be awarded for the top ten finishers in Pinawa, Lac Lemay (Gatineau) and Summerside. Points will go to top fifteen at Teck Cominco Canadian Junior Elite Championships.
- Points for the Teck Cominco race will be increased to reflect the stronger field (125%).
- Placing at National Championships will be used to break any ties.

Eligibility of Non-Canadians

- The participation of non-Canadians is welcome in individual races as this contributes to the objective of providing experience in a highly competitive race environment.
- Non-Canadians will be eligible for medals (if available) at each individual event.
- Only Canadian athletes are eligible for travel assistance credit (if available) with both the individual events and overall series awards.
- To ensure safety standards are preserved, non-Canadians must provide proof that they have been certified to participate in draft-legal races. It will be the responsibility of local race organizers and the PGB to ensure this requirement is met.
