



Marc Duncan Bursary Fund

Marc was a troubled native BC teen who was taken under the wing of a BC couple and introduced to triathlon. He became an outstanding junior triathlete who represented Canada at the 1991 World Triathlon Championships in Australia. Tragically, he was killed in a house fire two years later. His coach and mentor, Todd Clark, along with many of his training partners and friends asked TriBC to establish a fund in his name to assist other junior athletes in financial need to meet their sport goals.

This fund provides aid to talented junior triathletes for the costs associated with training, racing and / or equipment. The following guidelines have been established for the fund:

- TriBC will disburse a minimum of \$500 total once a year to one or multiple junior athletes.
- No disbursement will be less than \$250.
- The disbursement committee will consist of a minimum of one board member and one member of the community.

The junior triathlete eligible for the fund should meet the following criteria:

- 16-23 years old as of December 31 of the year of the award
- A member in good standing of TriBC
- A resident of BC for the past year
- A Canadian Citizen or Landed Immigrant
- Show dedication to our sport through participation in TriBC sanctioned local and provincial duathlon or triathlon events (preference will be given to those who participated in the Provincial Race Series and Provincial Championships).

If you are interested in applying for the bursary or know of a deserving young athlete, please send a letter of application outlining how you meet the established criteria.
